# It is strongly recommended that you limit your groups to 10 people or less

## Instruct your group to turn off cell phones and tablets and put them away before you begin

Tell your group where to get copies of the range rules: THEIR CLUB, AGC website, document bin under TV in Barnes Range House, any RSO, the Office Manager.

#### I. 100-yard all-purpose (Barnes) range, 100 positions

- Impact Area Ensure Target height so rounds hit impact area
- Firing Line
  - Safe Firearm Mag. out, bolt open, empty chamber, ECI inserted.
  - Firearm Muzzle pointed up, or down range, at all times.
  - Cease Fire make Firearm safe and don't touch till range is hot.
  - Black Powder pointed up during a ceasefire. Pistols use racks. Black Powder discharge on cease fire after coordination with RSO.
  - Black powder must fire a cap on all chambers with the firearm pointed downrange prior to loading to ensure it was not previously loaded.
  - Point out forward edge of concrete pad, white stripe, orange poles and explain their purpose.
  - Positions 91-100 are restricted to shooting while seated on attached stool ONLY.
  - Firing line position numbers must match target emplacements. Cross firing is not permitted.
  - $\circ$   $\;$  Front legs of shooting bench must be at forward edge of the concrete pad.
  - Point out wedge/brass/dud buckets, trash cans, brooms and dust pans.
- **Targets and Frames** Target emplacements for positions 1 90 at 25, 50, and 100 yards, and at 50 and 100 yards for positions 91 100.

### II. 50-yard range, 58 positions

- Impact Area Ensure Target height so rounds hit Impact Area. 25-yard and 50-yard berms are NOT impact areas.
- Caliber/Usage Restrictions Handguns with barrels 10" or shorter firing Handgun Caliber rounds only.
- Firing Line
  - $\circ$  Safe Firearm Mag. out, bolt open, empty chamber, ECI inserted.
  - Pistol muzzles must always be pointed down range or straight up (when transporting) to include casing/uncasing, racking slides, loading and unloading.
  - Point out forward edge of concrete pad and white stripe and explain their use.
  - Shooting is ONLY permitted in standing position or seated on a stool.
  - Pistol muzzles shall be forward of the front edge of the concrete pad when fired.
  - $\circ$   $\;$  Point out wedge/brass/dud buckets, trash cans, brooms and dust pans  $\;$
- Targets and Frames
  - No Personal Targets allowed in center of range Firing Lanes (targets 28+29) due to buried electrical cable that runs to the 25 yard line.
  - Metal target frames at 25 and 50-yards must use 24X24" cardboard or paper target w/single, centered aiming point ONY.
  - AGC Metal target frames shall not remain mounted in your shooting lane unless you are using them to hold your desired paper target.

## III. 200 Yard Range, 10 positions

- Impact Area Ensure Target placement so rounds hit impact area (dirt bank behind 200-yard pits).
  - Exception Hunting and Silhouette handguns
  - No targets in impact area
- Firing Line

•

- Point out forward edge of concrete pad and white stripes and explain their use.
- Leaving firearms unattended on this range is prohibited. Point out lockable lockers.
- Point out Orange flag must be placed in holder whenever someone is downrange.
- Point out wedge/brass/dud buckets, trash cans, brooms and dust pans.
- Pits
  - Describe Military Style Target Carriage usage. RSO for keys to unlock.
  - Match Director required for people to remain in pits while shooting. Positive 2 way communications (Radio/walkie talkie required. Cell phones are NOT acceptable for this use)
- Targets and Frames
  - Show Military Style Target Frame location and describe safe use.
  - Show Personal Target frame holders on back side of 200-yard berm.

#### IV. Archery Range, 4 positions

- Caliber/Usage Restrictions Only Field or Target points on arrows. No Broadheads
- Firing Line

•

- o Establish common firing line with other users of the archery range. "Sky drawing" is prohibited
- Must follow same cease fire rules used at other ranges. Do not touch bow during a ceasefire. Point out bow rack.
- **Targets** May use personal targets. See RSO for to unlock or obtain AGC Targets

#### V. Shotgun Patterning Range

- Caliber/Usage Restrictions
  - Patterning only; practice may be done on the 100-yard range.
  - Shotshells only; Maximum shot sizes #2 lead, BBB steel
  - Only one single aiming point, centered on the backboard, is permitted.
  - Show the paper roll and "measuring string" under the overhang on Memorial Hall and demonstrate their use.

# VI. Trap Fields (4 fields, each one treated as an independent range for Cease Fires and operation)

- Caliber/Usage Restrictions 7.5, 8, or 9 shot, 1,200 fps maximum muzzle velocity, maximum powder load of 3dram equivalent.
- Impact Area
  - Point out orange cone. Emphasize that orange cone must be placed on trap house whenever someone is downrange. Orange cone on trap house – no shooting.
  - Shooter is responsible for refilling trap machine. Show how to turn off trap machine and reload safely.
    Do not stand in front when turning off trap machine!!
- Firing Line
  - Point out 16 yard line and handicap line.
  - Trap #4 is a wobble trap which is available for member use
  - Badge holder may have up to 4 guests on firing line.
  - Shotguns shall remain unloaded with action open until it is your turn to shoot.
  - Shoot mounted from shoulder only.
  - Purchase trap tickets at Barnes Range House.
- Throwers
  - o Additional throwers available for rent; see RSO for access and instructions.

• Personal throwers may be used. Must be placed on or behind the 16-yard line.

#### VII. Pellet Range (6 firing positions)

- Caliber/Usage Restrictions
  - Blunt nose lead pellets weighing less than 25 grains only.
  - Maximum allowable velocity is 1,000 fps for .177 cal and 800 fps for .22 cal.
  - Firing Line The black line on the floor is the firing line.
- Impact Area

- Ask RSO for access to target traps.
- Describe how to move pellet traps to different heights.
